Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes

June 15, 2021

CALL TO ORDER:

- Meeting called order @ 6:41 PM by D. Tillman
- Members present: D. Tillman, T. Lewelling, D. Fields, R. Dalton, T. Huffhines
- Invocation by D. Fields
- Pledges of Allegiance were recited.

BUSINESS ITEMS:

1. OFFICER'S REPORTS AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- T. Lewelling and T. Huffhines signed checks this month.
- TL motion to approve minutes of meeting held 5/18/2021, T. Huffhines seconds – approved by all.
- D. Tillman – monthly check signing and money transfers
- R. Dalton – visited SCFD ON 6/9 to sign minutes from 4/21 meeting and meet auditors (auditors had already left)

2. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT/SCFD: Chief Teague

- 60 calls – 10 minute average response time
- No significant calls in May but since June 5th river levels have been causing concern
- Granbury not letting water out fast enough can be the bigger problem once PK has opened all three gates.
- The last two times Granbury has been more responsive and it has helped.
- Only 5 to 6 roads barricaded in Horseshoe Bend and only 2 vehicles driven off into the water
- Evacuated 2 people out of one home
- Shelter opened at Spring Creek Baptist Church – 12 people put up at one time.
- Issue: Once Tri-County cuts off the electricity people start getting frustrated because the outage impacts people that aren't impacted by the flood otherwise.
- ~12 homes with water in them – no injuries
- Several dehydration cases – reminders to volunteers to hydrate ahead of time
- One overhead door broken (bracket needed) at SCFD – awaiting parts
- New construction noted on Tin Top – over 200 new home sites planned.

3. FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT – CRESSON: Chief Becker (May report rec'd for filing)

- Total of 69 calls in May vs. last May's 48 (341 YTD vs. 322 at same point last yr.)
- Breakdown of calls for the month of April:
 - PCESD6 = 17, City w/in Parker County = 3, Johnson County = 8, Hood County = 22, Tarrant = 19 ESD6 - 0
 - 30 were EMS calls; 16 MVA's
- Aircraft ELT search – was located in Hood County in an airport hangar.
- Worked a cardiac arrest on the E side of Granbury
- Car wreck on 377 involving a fatality
- Response time – 1 minute 39 second turnout, 2:00 travel time – Total 3:39
 - Unusually low times due to locations

4. UPDATE ON HIGH WATER ACTIVITY

- Food trailer operator wants to rent two parking spots at the SCFD at a rate of up to 500/month
- Generally viewed with reservations (access, safety, creating expectations, legal(?), etc.) but not objected to outright
- A 90 day trial period was discussed – limiting hours, days, etc.

- o Issue tabled pending more details and terms of agreement (days of week, hours of operation, specific location, etc.) - Add to June agenda for review.

5. UPDATE ON STATUS OF MANPOWER / VOLUNTEERS

CRESSON: Chief Becker

- o Total roster of 72 - 8 seniors, 5 on Mil/Educational Leave, 5 juniors and the Chaplain
- o Adult Responder total comes to 52 - (same as last year) 30 members and 22 in probationary period
- o 25 are EMS certified, 2 Volunteers are working out west on forest fires
- o Training:
 - o 8 volunteers finished up Tarrant County College Firefighter 1 & 2 training - need final testing.
 - o 2 have completed EMT class and doing ride-outs
 - o 2 are doing on-line skills week training for Fire Academy to get their PCFT.
- o Turnouts - had 14 turnout for the Aircraft search incident - 8 for cardiac arrest

SPRING CREEK: G. Teague

- o After May vote we went from 37 to 42 volunteers
- o 2 new applications in
 - o One is Jerry Blaisdell's grandson - just rec'd EMT NAT'L Registry
 - o The other just graduated RN school
- o Two other vol's got their EMT NAT'L registry.
- o Skill levels are trending up but experience level is still fairly low
- o Texas Search and Rescue provided a boat to assist with one of the two evacs - they made their boat available Tue-Thu.
- o July Agenda?
 - o Preliminary Budget proposal expected - based on current tax rates
 - o Cresson will also provide their preliminary budget figures
- o Currently have collected 871K and have 64K in arrears from 2019 and 2020
- o The rest of delinquent taxes go back to 2007 - small amounts
- o ~742.00's held back to pay for gas leases from 2014.
- o ESD3 donated ESD6 a fire truck
 - o Estimated \$500 in repairs to fix a leak in water tank and repair valves (18K miles on vehicle)
