# Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes August 20, 2024

#### CALL TO ORDER:

- Meeting called to order @ 7:24 PM by D.Tillman
- o Members present: T. Lewelling, R. Dalton, T. Huffhines, D. Tillman, S. Harrison
- o Invocation by T. Huffhines
- o Pledges of Allegiance recited.

#### **BUSINESS ITEMS:**

## 1. OFFICER REPORTS AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR APRIL 16, 2024 BOARD MEETING:

- T. Huffhines signed checks and attended a meeting with a prospective architect to plan for new building on Tin Top and T. Lewelling paid visits to sign checks
- o S. Harrison listened in on the Safe-D training for taxation
- o D. Tillman transferred funds to pay bills and buy the utility truck
- o T. Huffhines motions to approve minutes from July 16th Board meeting, T. Lewelling seconds all in favor

#### 2. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT/MANPOWER - VOLUNTEERS- SCFD:

- 41 total personnel on roster 3 applications pending, 1 resignation, 1 terminated, 1 on time off, 1 reduced in rank, 2 fully TCFP certified, 1 new EMS certified
  - o 5 hired last month are working out well
- o All facilities are in fine working order.
- Engine 44 parts came in and will be repaired after Labor day
- Brush truck 344 is having have a new turbocharger installed now has a bent driveshaft due to being highcentered on a rock – waiting on parts
- o Tanker 44 has a leaking pump and has been taken in for a fix.
- Chief Teague will be receiving medical care (right knee scope)
- Generator purchased with last year's fund to be installed this winter
- Call volume: Total of 71 in July (15 Fire, 43 EMS, all others 13 (Hazards, Service calls, Good intent, and SVR WX/Natural Disaster)
- o Call times 1:16 turnout, 11:34 travel time, Time on scene ~35 minutes
- o Other metrics, including call data by zone, on file

## 3. FIRE DEPARTMENT CRESSON

- o July 91 calls, 530 YTD (vs. 502 YTD in 2023)
- o Breakdown: Parker County (ESD6) 19, Cresson-3, Johnson-4, Hood 21, and Tarrant 44
- o Call times: Turnout 1:21, Travel 7:29, Total avg. 8:50 avg. total minutes
- Southbound Cresson bypass is open, Northbound lanes may be open by Thanksgiving
- Significant calls:
  - o 8/14 Fire on the Moncrief Ranch over 236 acres burned in one section alone
    - Forestry Service was on scene as well
- Manpower:
  - o Responders 60 (Responders 29, Probationary 28, Juniors 3)
  - o Leaves 20 (1- Education, 3-Military, 8- Seniors, 8- Special Members)
  - o Total roster 80
  - 15 ECA's, 7 EMT's, (Paramedics) for a total or 31 EMS Responders (2 Registered Nurses)
  - 1 applications pending

## 4. DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED 2024-2025 BUDGET - SCFD

- Also discussed in Special Meeting
- Health Insurance (PPO) rates are discussed 4 different quotes (levels of coverage)
  - Various levels of coverage are under consideration (Blue Cross Blue Shield)
  - Employee only coverage
  - o Various deductible levels are an option lowest deductible runs 39K/per annum
  - Details pending for September meeting
  - Multiple variables will influence rates e.g. numbers covered, uninsured status, age of those covered – HMOs do not seem feasible and PPO provides the best coverage per rate.
- Retirement fund and Health Insurance to be considered after more details are provided.
- o Partial (less than 1 per shift) full time coverage discussed deemed as neither ideal or competitive

#### 5. DISCUSSION OF CRESSON BUDGET REQUEST FOR 2024-2025

 Proposes annual contract payment of 140K (up from 120K this year) – this equals 76% of the estimated costs to service ESD6 calls – no increase in the last budget cycle

# 6. DISCUSSION OF PURCHASE OF UTILITY TRUCK – 2024 CHEVROLET SILVERADO 1500 IN THE AMOUNT OF APPROXIMATELY \$48,000

 R. Dalton motions to approve the PURCHASE of a new UTILITY TRUCK – (2024 CHEVROLET SILVERADO 1500 IN THE AMOUNT OF APPROXIMATELY \$48,000), T. Lewelling seconds the motion – all in favor

#### 7. UPDATE OF OUR AGREEMENT WITH THE PARKER COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT

- Reviewed preliminary design issues for a new combined facility with ambulance facility on one end and Fire facility on the other end with bays in the middle with an Architect.
  - 19K for cost estimate on design (not decided to go that route)
  - May consider a Design/Build process after an RFP
    - Design/Build cost on a per hour basis is estimated at ~2.5 million
    - Not sure if Hospital District is going to fund and build or partially fund the build with financing
    - Designs expected in time for the September meeting Floor plan and Elevation cost estimates
    - An administrative 3<sup>rd</sup> party functioning between builder and financer
    - Hospital District is not settled on financing yet
  - o Architect will produce a line drawing to help consider use of space
  - o The facility is expected to take up to 4 of the 5 lots
  - o 50 foot setback planned for a facility
  - o 5th lot may be used as a parking lot and a drive around the back of the facility
  - o Fire facility is planned for the north end of the lots to keep it closer to existing facility
  - o Old blue building planned for tear down.

#### 8. UPDATE ON STATUS OF THE 3 LOTS ON TIN TOP ROAD NEXT TO STATION 2:

- o Property on Tin Top report: 60 days until ESD6 can take possession
- No sign of any clearing as of 8/20/2024
